



Serger troubleshooting

Problem	Possible reasons	How to fix it
Your machine won't start	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Your cable is not installed correctly • Your on/off switch is not yet switched on • Your looper cover is still open 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Install your cable correctly • Turn on your machine • Make sure ur looper cover is properly closed
Your serger skips stitches	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Your needles are slightly bent or dull • Your needles are not pushed all the way up • Your needle size or needle type do not match your fabric • The thread tension for your needles is set too high • Your presser foot pressure is set too low 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Replace your needles with new ones • Make sure your needles are pushed all the way up • Make sure you have matched your needles to your fabric (the thicker the fabric, the higher the needle size) • Reduce the thread tension of your needles • Increase your presser foot pressure • Rethreading once can always help
Your thread keeps breaking	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Your serger thread is not of good quality • The thread tension for the corresponding thread is set too high • There is an issue with the threading • The thread cannot run properly through your machine • Your needles need to be replaced • Your needle type or size is not matching your fabric 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Rethreading your machine resolves the issue in 90% of cases • Be sure to use a high-quality serger thread • Reduce your thread tension for the corresponding thread • Make sure your needles are pushed all the way up • Make sure your thread can run smoothly through your machine • Replace your needles completely, especially if the needle thread keeps breaking • Make sure you use the right needle size and type for your fabric
Your needle breaks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Your needle is bent, dull or damaged • Your needles are not pushed all the way up • Your needle size or type is not matching your fabric. The needle size may be too small • You pulled on the fabric while serging • There is an issue with the threading • The needle thread tension is too high 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Replace your needles regularly, at least after 6-8 hours of pure sewing time • Make sure your needles are pushed all the way up • Guide the fabric gently while serging, using both hands • Rethreading can always help • Reduce your thread tension on the needle thread • Make sure that the needle size and needle type are matching your fabric

Serger troubleshooting

Problem	Possible reasons	How to fix it
Your seam is waving or puckering	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Your differential feed is set incorrectly Your presser foot pressure is set too high You pulled on the fabric while serging Your stitch length is set too low for your fabric 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Increase your differential feet setting Reduce your presser foot pressure Guide your fabric gently, with both hands Increase your stitch length
Your serger seam is being pulled together	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Thread tension of the needles is set too high Your stitch length is set too low Your differential feet is set incorrectly 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Reduce the thread tension of your needle threads Increase your stitch length Decrease or increase your differential feed depending on the fabric
The loops in your serger seam are too loose	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Your thread tension for the looper threads is set too low 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Increase the thread tension of your looper threads
Your needle thread is visible on the outside of the seam	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Your needle thread tension for the leftmost needle is set too low 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Increase the thread tension of your leftmost needle
Your needle threads form loops in the seam	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Your needle thread tension for the leftmost needle is set too low. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Increase the thread tension of your leftmost needle
Your serger seam rolls up	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Your thread tension for the looper threads is set too high Your stitch finger is still deactivated/your serger is still set for a rolled hem 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Reduce the thread tension of your looper threads Activate your stitch finger/set your serger for a normal serger stitch
Your knife is not cutting the fabric properly	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Your knife is dull You are serging with a very thick fabric or with too many layers of fabric 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Replace your knife Cut your seam allowance in a way that it runs along the blade without cutting the fabric

Serger troubleshooting

Problem	Possible reasons	How to fix it
Your machine is "eating" your fabric	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Your fabric is too thin• You only serge with one layer of fabric	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Use embroidery stabilizer on your fabric to prevent it from being pulled into the machine, especially at the beginning of the seam
Your rolled hem forms knots	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Your stitch length is set too low	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Increase your stitch length
Your serger is noticeably loud	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Your machine is not threaded correctly• Your needle plate is not properly attached• You are sewing on uneven ground• Your needles need to be replaced• Your machine needs to be oiled	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Rethreading can always help• Make sure your needle plate is properly attached and the screw is tightened• Sew on a even ground• Change your needles regularly• Oil your machine as indicated in your manual
You hear a clicking tone from your needles	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Your needles are bend• Your entire needle bar is bend	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Your needles need to be replaced• Your machine needs to be professionally repaired
Your seam stands over the edge	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Your stitch width is set too low• You are serging too faar away from ur knife	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Higher your stitch width• Make sure to serge close to ur knife
