

## The mission of the Washington Free Public Library is:

### Visiting the Library Today:

Today the library enjoys increased use in many forms. Circulation has gone up, computer/internet use has increased as has use of our various meeting and study spaces. In addition, the library is much more accessible to the handicapped. We are also proud of the green emphasis throughout the building which emphasizes natural light, water efficiency, an underground heating/cooling system, and automated lighting to help save resources.



The library became LEED certified in 2011:

"The LEED® green building certification program is the nationally accepted benchmark for the design, construction, and operation of green buildings."

In 2009 the library won a Best New Construction award from Main Street Iowa.

Our building has also been featured in the Corridor Business Journal and CBJ's 2012 Green Symposium.

The library continues to expand in various ways including our Spanish language collection, extended programming for all ages, and continuing pursuit of technological advances in circulation, materials, and information access. Our goal is to continue to serve this area of Washington County well into the 21st century!



In 1901 Jane A. Chilcote bequeathed her house at 120 E. Main to the City of Washington to use as a public library. The Chilcote house was extensively remodeled to serve as the library. During the 40's and 50's the house had begun to seriously deteriorate. In 1952 the city undertook the construction of a new building on the site, funded in large part by major donations from Fort Sherman and Ralph Smith. The building built in 1952 was about 7,100 square feet and included an upstairs meeting room and a storage / research room. The gallery was remodeled in 1971.



The Washington Public Library was established in 1877 by a group of dedicated volunteers with a combination of private donations and a small public tax. The library was housed in the Stone Mill building and later in the old City Hall, now called the McCreedy building. Many of the original books came from General Hiram Scofield, a civil war general who lived in Washington and held one of the largest private libraries in the nation. The library still owns most of these books.

From 1952 until the early 90's, the building succeeded as a modern library; however as early as 1988 it was clear that more space was needed. The library had expanded children's programming, created a genealogical department, and begun to provide access to computer technology. In 1988 the Library Board initiated a fund raising campaign to construct an elevator. The project soon developed into a plan to expand the library 18 feet to the west to utilize the space that existed between the library and the Jones-Eden Funeral Home.

### **New Library Building Project Timeline**

**1997** Space needs assessment by George Lawson with state aid.

**1998** Establishment of the WPL Foundation, a 501(c)3.

**2001** \$123,725 released to Foundation from Nondas Richardson Trust.

**2002** \$423,108 from estate of David Elder transferred to the Foundation.

**2004 Feb.** Space needs assessment and site analysis by Herb Stone.

**May** Option to purchase secured for downtown site. Initial structural analysis by Herb Stone.

**Dec.** Library received okay to proceed from City Council.

Fund raising feasibility study conducted.

Project presented to community organizations.

Entered into negotiations with owners.

**2005 Feb.** City Council person appointed as liaison to the Foundation.

OPN Architects from Cedar Rapids was selected.

Worked with OPN to develop a refined space needs report.

Proposals requested from fund raising consultants.

Coffey & Associates, Inc from Washington, IA selected.

**Jun.** Hosted 2½ day public design charrette.

OPN and library staff worked to refine the floor plan.

**Sep.** Released the results of the charrette—34,500 sq. ft. space.

**2006 Spring** Began the fundraising campaign for the project.

**2007 Nov.** \$1.1 million bond referendum passed.

2008 Jun. Construction began.

**2009 Oct.** The new library opened October 1, 2009.
