This form was prepared as part of a research/survey/nomination project in 2011-2012 funded by a HRDP grant from the State Historical Society of Iowa for the nomination of the Washington Downtown Historic District. The project was primarily structured to develop the nomination for the downtown, with additional research on each building documented on an Iowa Site Inventory form. The information below is taken from the table in the August 2012 draft of the nomination, with additional information documented on the property and photographs in the following sections.

#### 7. Narrative Description

Central Park has three contributing features - the park itself as the central public square in the downtown, the Centennial Fountain, and the Civil War monument. The public square was designated in the plat of 1839. The Centennial Fountain was built in the center of the park on the site of the second courthouse and later a bandstand. It was part of the centennial celebration of the founding of the city, and was dedicated on August 7, 1939. It is hexagonal with two layers. The design is Art Deco with several triple grooves on each panel. It features a multi-colored light show and changing patterns of water jets. The Civil War memorial is a granite marker (southeast corner) with a bronze plaque reading "1861 1865 Dedicated in Honor of the Civil War Veterans of Washington County by the I.C. White Womans Relief Corps. No.45 Washington, Iowa - Nov. 11, 1931".

The park contains a non-contributing structure, non-contributing object, and non-contributing building: The Ralph M. Smith Memorial Bandstand (in the southwest corner) (described separately as well in State # 92-00490 DT 100b), George Washington bust (southeast corner), and a public rest room building (northeast corner). The George Washington bust was placed on an aggregate stone pedestal as part of the 1976 Bicentennial celebration. The original bust was made of fiberglass. In 2012, it was replaced by a bronze one paid for by private donations. The rest room building was erected by the Jaycees in 1984. It is made of a buff colored brick to match the brick of the bandstand. Page 2

Several light posts and permanent park benches are not tabulated. The historic lamp posts were refitted with new, energy efficient lights and new globes in 2007. There are 24 historic posts, and all of them were moved from their original locations on street corners. They are sited within the park and long the four sides of the park. The lamp posts on the corners are new, but the others along the edges of the park are historic ones.

#### 8. Narrative Statement of Significance

Central Park appears to contribute historically to the Washington Downtown Historic District. The park, fountain, and Civil War memorial are counted as contributing features within the park and historic district.

The one square block in the center of Washington's business district is known as Central Park. It was reserved as a public square in the original city plat of 1839. It has also been called the Public Park and the Public Square. The county's second courthouse was in the center of the lot from 1847 until 1868. The 1885 Sanborn map shows a large cistern in the northwest corner of the square and four other wells on the square, including two noted as "fire wells" for the new fire department. The 1892 and 1897 maps show the same wells and cistern on the public square. Nothing is shown in the park on the 1902 map. A small bandstands appears towards the northeast corner on the 1909 map. This bandstand was removed with a new larger bandstand toward the southwest corner on the 1917 and 1931 maps. The 1943 Sanborn map shows this same bandstand, with no other detail in the park. Per local history, the first bandstand was built near the center of the park. It was moved to northeast of center so that a metal fountain could then be built in the center. After several years, it was removed and replaced with a concrete fountain, which remained here until 1939. Three of the wells were filled in, one left in the southeast corner ("Washington's Central Park First Called 'Commons," Centennial Edition, *Evening Journal*, 86).

H.A. Burrell described the public square in 1909 as complete with green grass, healthy trees, fountains, music stand, iron seats, cement walks, a circle of flowers by Elmer Keck (greenhouse and florist), and electric lights. The band played here on Saturday nights (Burrell 1909, Vol. 1: 433). An article on the park in *Evening Journal,* April 3, 1926, page 8 notes that Central Park, or the public square, was a thing of joy and beauty. Band concerts were held here in summer months, and a fountain was in the center of the park. The park commissioners and Washington Improvement League worked to maintain the park, and they had placed flower boxes in lamp posts in the past few years. The fountain in the center of the park had flowers around the basin. The park and shade of the trees was enjoyed by thousands each year.

Two memorials were installed in the park in this period, followed by a new fountain in 1939. An elm tree was planted in 1924 and dedicated to Civil War veterans by Women's Relief Corps. They followed this effort with a granite monument with bronze plate for Civil War soldiers in 1931. The iron railing around

park installed in 1881 and used as a hitching post was taken down in 1934 ("Washington's Central Park First Called 'Commons,'" Centennial Edition, *Evening Journal*, 86).

In 1938, the chairman of park board, J.E. Lemmon, saw a fountain with colored lights in Missouri and thought to install a similar one in Washington as part of the centennial celebration in 1939. They announced plans in January and researched many other fountains in other cities before settling on one identical to one in University City in St. Louis, MO. It was bought from the Brenner Electric Company of St. Louis with funds from the city, Chamber of Commerce, and donations to meet the \$2,500 cost. The old fountain was then torn out and new fountain installed ("Fountain Idea Conceived Over Year Ago," Centennial Celebration, *Evening Journal*, August 1939, 5)

In 1952, the Ralph M. Smith Memorial Band Stand was built in the southwest quarter of the park. It was a brick and concrete structure, with a curved back wall. The 1952 bandstand was demolished in 2008, except the back wall. A new one was built incorporating the original back wall in 2010. The new bandstand has a much larger performance area, off stage storage and dressing areas and a roof over the performing area. The front panel replicates the architectural base of the Centennial Fountain. The columns supporting the roof match the brickwork of the rest of the structure.

A number of other improvements have occurred over the last few decades in the park. The bust of George Washington was placed in the southeast quarter in 1976, with a time capsule to be opened in 2076. New sidewalks have been installed, along with new handrails. A restroom building was constructed in 1984 in the northeast quarter as a project of the Washington Jaycees (*Souvenir History of Washington* 1989: 20).

Since its inception it has remained the center of community life and celebrations. Numerous public events and band concerts take place in the park each year.






