7. Narrative Description

This is a two-story brick building which has been recently remodeled. It sits on the east side of the square, facing Central Park and S. Iowa Ave to the west. The storefront has been replaced with pale tan-gray brick. The primary entry is on the left and slightly recessed, with an angled wall from the sidewalk to the door. There is a single tinted light with a brick sill in this angled wall, and below the window is a mail slot. On the main portion of the first floor facade, there is a single tinted window with a brick sill. The remainder of the facade is brick, including the transom area. On the far right, there is a steel secondary door. The second story has historic tan brick and two windows. The oriel window on the left has been removed and replaced by a large tinted window with metal infill down to the level of the awning. There are narrow pilasters on either side of the window, and a fan design over the window. This window is unusually large because it replaced the oriel window. To the right there is a single-light tinted window in a double-hung window opening, which has a flared jack arch brick lintel and a stone sill. Brown metal appears to cover the bracketed cornice, as it flares away from the building as it rises to the top of the building.

8. Narrative Statement of Significance

This commercial building appears to be non-contributing in the Washington Downtown Historic District. The historic photographs show a different storefront, an oriel window and double-hung window on the second story, and a bracketed cornice. The storefront has been remodeled, second story windows changed, and cornice covered in metal. Due primarily to these latter two alterations, the building does not appear to retain sufficient integrity to be contributing within the historic district.

The property was transferred to Dr. C.L. Keedy in November 1866, and an ad that same year in the *Washington Press* advised that his office is over the East Side Drug Store. In 1879, the property is transferred to James C. Miller. The 1885 Sanborn map identifies the use as Grocery, but no ads from that time were found to identify the proprietor. From the appearance of the Sanborn buildings, the 1885 building is an earlier building that that seen on the 1892 map. In April 1902, the property is transferred to S.B. Dewey and F.L. Wilson, and it remained in the Dewey family until 1974. The facade brick and lintel detail would suggest construction in the first decade of the 20th century, and the building footprint changes between the 1902 and 1909 Sanborn maps. The building goes from a two-story, 28-foot tall building on the west half of the lot to a two-story 26-foot building with a large rear section and skylights on both sections. Interestingly, the oriel window on the facade, seen in historic postcards of the block from prior to the 1913 remodeling of the adjacent bank through the photographs in the 1970s, is never detailed on the Sanborn maps.

The early 1900s postcard shows this building with the oriel window and cornice also shows an awning that appears to say "hats." The 1909 Sanborn map shows a clothing store here. In 1909, an ad for Gardner & Bridger, Men's Outfitters, appears in the *Washington Journal*, and they appear again in the city directory (1910). The 1917 Sanborn map shows a confectionery here. In 1921, Leo Nardi and Julius Sodini opened The Chocolate Shop here. The 1931 and 1943 Sanborn maps show the store with "candy manufacturing" noted in the basement. The Chocolate Shop is listed in the 1926 telephone directory at this address, and remains here until 1974.

In May 1995, Farmers Mutual Insurance Association purchased this property, and they had been located in the adjacent building since the 1930s. They sold the corner building in 2001, moving to this location. The upper portion of the facade has been remodeled since this time, removing the bay window and replacing the double-hung window with a single-light window. The current occupant is Farmers Mutual Insurance Association.



Location map




2009 aerial photograph (Washington County) – line indicates survey/research area boundary


