This form was prepared as part of a research/survey/nomination project in 2011-2012 funded by a HRDP grant from the State Historical Society of Iowa for the nomination of the Washington Downtown Historic District. The project was primarily structured to develop the nomination for the downtown, with additional research on each building documented on an Iowa Site Inventory form. 7. Narrative Description

The building at 115 E. Washington is two story, double-width, symmetrical buff brick structure. The first story has the main entry centered in a Richardsonian style brick arch with stone columns on the bottom half and stone cornice across the top. Secondary entries are located on either side of the center entry arch. They have flared jack arch brick lintels. On the opposite/outside of these entries is a large window opening with soldier brick arch lintel that continues down the top portion of the sides as shoulders. These openings currently have three tall windows with transom windows. Oriel windows are centered above these windows on the second story. The oriel windows have decorative flower/plant detail across the bulkheads and frieze, which has been recently painted. Each oriel windows has three one-over-one-light double-hung window. Four one-over-one-light double-hung windows are located between the oriel windows, and they have flared jack brick arch lintels and stone sills. Red brick detail is found above these windows in a series of five diamond outlines. The building has a decorative metal cornice with fleur-de-lies on the frieze and dentils under the rounded indented cornice line.

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8. Narrative Statement of Significance

The Roberts Building appears to contribute historically and architecturally to the Washington Downtown Historic District.

The property was purchased by Jackson Roberts on March 21, 1891 from Mr. William Beard. County histories and census records list him as a lawyer in Washington in his 50s in the 1880s. Jackson and Margaret Roberts moved to Washington from Vermont in 1867, and they were both prominent local residents. Family information on Ancestry.com shows that he died in 1897. The 1897 Sanborn map shows a small building on this lot, while the 1902 Sanborn map shows the current two-story, double-width building, with an office in the east office (113), vacant in the west half (115), and a shared skylight in the middle of the rear. Thus, the building may have been recently completed in 1902, similar to the building to the west. It appears to have then been built for his widow, Margaret Roberts. The 1903 city directory lists residences on the second story: 115 ½ Edwin & Gertrude Bowman (grocer) and 113 ½ JE & Alyce Lemmon (druggist). The 1909 Sanborn map shows offices at both 113 and 115. The property would have provided rental income for Margaret Roberts.

Margaret Roberts, widow, sold property to S.W. & T.L. Brookhart, brothers, on March 5, 1910. The operated the attorney firm of Brookhart Brothers. A 1910 city directory lists George H. Paul Co. doing business in investments out of 115 E. Washington. By 1921, Brookhart Brothers were operated from 115. They remained here through the 1920s. The 1926 Telephone directory lists 113 E. Washington as Applegate Realty.

Nellie Brookhart et al sold her interest in the building to SW Brookhart on November 26, 1930. The 1931 Sanborn map shows both halves as offices. By 1932, the law office evolved to T.L. Brookhart, and he continued to be listed here in the 1941 city directory. Miss PG Gardner lived at 115 ½. Dr. William L. Alcorn is listed at 113 in the 1935 and 1941 directories.

On January 5, 1939, SW Brookhart & wife sold the property to Lucill & Carol Forgey. The 1941 directory lists Dr. William L. Alcorn at 113, TL Brookhart at 115, and Miss Pearl G. Gardner in 115 $\frac{1}{2}$. Lucille & Carol Forgey sold the property to Stella W. Lachem on January 2, 1945.

Stella W. Lachem sold property on March 3, 1945 to Paul R. Horak and W.H. Stephens. The 1952 telephone directory lists Dr. W. Homer Stephens (optometry) and Horak Insurance at 113 E. Washington. The law office of Stewart & Shearer is listed at 115.

In January 1953, Grace Stephens sold her interest in property to Paul R. Horak. The 1956 directory lists Horak Insurance, Dr. Mallory – optometrist, and "Mail-Me Monday" accouting office at the 113 address, and Stewart & Shearer law office at the 115 address. The 1964 directory lists Horak Insurance and Hayes Insurance at 115 E. Washington. Mallory Optometry continues to be listed at 113. Pearl Gardner at 115 ½ and CA Pratt at 113 ½.

Bicentennial Edition, *Evening Journal*, July 1, 1976, 101 – Horak Insurance – 115 E. Washington – insurance, real estate, tax service – Travelers Insurance Company – Paul R. Horak

The building has recently undergone renovation, and Horak Insurance is still in business here.

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

Location map




2009 aerial photograph (Washington County) – line indicates survey/research area boundary

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Building plan (from assessor's website)




