#### **Narrative Description**

This is a one story frame ranch house built in 1957 on the east side of South Avenue B. The house sits on poured concrete slab, and the walls are clad in aluminum siding. The hip roof is covered with asphalt shingles, and the house has an inset southwest corner for the entry area. The windows are vinyl clad wood with aluminum storm / screens. A one-car garage is attached on the north side.

The front of the house (west elevation) is divided into three sections. The right/south section is the inset southwest corner, and it has a carpet covered concrete porch with three carpet covered concrete steps. Within this area, the main entry door is on the left/north and enters the center section of the facade. There is a wood front door with a window in the top half and an aluminum storm / screen door. Facing the street within this area, there is a six-over-six-light double-hung vinyl window. The center section is wider than the other two and protrudes several feet toward the street. It has a fixed picture window composed of a large light divided by vinyl muntins into four rows of five lights. Flanking each side of the large window, there is a four-over-four-light double-hung vinyl window. At ground level, and to the right of the picture window is a vent to the crawl space below the house. The left bay is a one-car attached garage with a metal garage door. To the right of the garage door, there is a six-over-six-light double-hung vinyl window is a vent to the crawl space below the house. The left bay is a one-car attached garage with a metal garage door. To the right of the garage door, there is a six-over-six-light double-hung vinyl window in the short north wall of the center section, just to the right/south of the garage section.

The north elevation has one six-over-six-light double-hung window at the center of the wall.

The south elevation has two equally spaced six-over-six-light double-hung vinyl windows, and there is a crawl space vent under the window closer to the street.

The east (rear) elevation has four windows and one door, extending from left/south to right/north. On the far left, there is a six-over-six-light double-hung vinyl window. The next window is both narrower and shorter than a typical window, and is a four-over-four-light double-hung vinyl window. The third window is also a small window, though a six-over-six-light double-hung vinyl window. The fourth window is similar to the first one, a larger six-over-six-light double-hung vinyl window. The rear entry has wood door with three horizontal windows that leads into the garage.

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#### Narrative Statement of Significance

The Thomas and Ida Berdo House (#2) appears to contribute historically to the potential "west side" residential historic district in Washington. The ranch house was built during the period of development in the early 1950s that subdivided earlier larger lots, and it is significant within this period of later development of the neighborhood. The period of significance for the historic district is anticipated to extend through 1969, so it would fall within this period.

This house does not appear eligible for individual listing on the National Register of Historic Places under Criteria A, B, or C. The house does not appear to have particular historical or architectural significance individually.

#### History / research summary of property

When Thomas and Ida Berdo purchased Lot 4 in 1953, there was a c.1890 house on the north half of the lot. At that time, Mr. Berdo was a real estate agent, and the Berdos lived at 215 W Jefferson, next door to the existing house on Lot 4. Thomas Berdo appears in city and telephone directories at 215 W Jefferson until 1956. This house on the south half of Lot 4 was then built around 1957. In the 1958 telephone directory, they live at 310 South Avenue B. The last directory entry for the Berdos at the 310 address is in the 1972 city directory. The property was transferred from Ida C. Berdo to Ida Lucille Fulton on March 15, 1974.


