Narrative Description

This is a one story frame ranch house with an attached car port in front of an attached one car garage. The foundation and carport floor are poured concrete. The walls are clad in aluminum siding. There are vinyl shutters flanking the windows on all sides except the rear of the house. The hip roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Most of the windows on the house retain original two-over-two-light double-hung windows with the two lights horizontally oriented. The house also retains paired corner windows, which is typical of this period.

The façade (east elevation) is divided into three bays, plus the carport/garage section to the north. A concrete walk with a metal railing extends across the front of the house from the driveway to the centered front entry. The entry door is wood with three individual horizontal windows, and it has an aluminum storm / screen door. To the left/south of the entry, there is a picture window consisting of a large fixed single-light window flanked by a horizontal two-over-two-light double-hung windows. At the right/northeast corner of the house, there is a pair of horizontal two-over-two-light double-hung windows, with a shutter on the left side only. All windows have aluminum storm / screens. The carport is located at the northeast corner of the house, extending west along the north side with a garage setback on the west half of the north side. The east side of the garage has a garage door with four windows across the top of the door, and a wood entry door with an aluminum storm / screen door to the south/left.

The north elevation then includes the side of the house within the carport and the side of the garage. At the front/northeast corner of the house, there is a pair of horizontal two-over-two-light double-hung windows, with a shutter to the right. The windows complement the windows on the east side of this corner. To the right, there is a smaller horizontal two-over-two-light double-hung window. The sill of this window is higher than the windows to the left. On the north side of the garage, there a horizontal two-over-two-light double-hung window. All the windows on this side of the house have aluminum storm / screens and black vinyl shutters.

The south elevation is divided into three bays. On the left/west, there is a double-hung window with aluminum storm / screens and black vinyl shutters. Approximately in the center of the wall, there is a smaller double-hung window with aluminum storm / screens and black vinyl shutters whose sill is higher than most of the windows in the house. On the right/east, there is a pair of horizontal two-over-two-light double-hung windows with aluminum storm / screens and black vinyl shutters.

The west elevation, the rear of the house, has no windows or doors on the rear of the garage on the east end. Roughly at the center of the rear wall, there is a pair of horizontal two-over-two-light double-hung windows with aluminum storm / screens. On the right/south side of the wall, there is a horizontal two-over-two-light double-hung window with aluminum storm / screens. None of these windows have shutters.

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Narrative Statement of Significance

The Howard and Elizabeth Wittrig House appears to contribute historically and architecturally to the potential "west side" residential historic district in Washington. The ranch house was built during the period of development in the early 1950s that subdivided earlier larger lots, and it is significant within this period of later development of the neighborhood. The house retains a number of features characteristic of homes of this period, including horizontal two-over-two-light double-hung wood windows, windows around a corner, and picture windows. The period of significance for the historic district is anticipated to extend through 1969, so it would fall within this period.

This house does not appear eligible for individual listing on the National Register of Historic Places under Criteria A, B, or C. The house does not appear to have particular historical or architectural significance individually.

History / research summary of property (chronological order, by owner/period):

This parcel (north 67' of Lot 8) was historically owned as part of the larger Lot 8 with the house at 302 W. Jefferson on the south portion of the lot. On June 1, 1956, Tina M. Holt Bain and her husband, owners of Lot 8, sold the north 67 feet of lot 8 to contractor Donald S. Foss. The assessor then lists a construction date of 1957. On January 14, 1958, Foss transferred the property to Howard L. Wittrig. Howard and Elizabeth Wittrig, retired, are first listed at this address in the 1958 telephone directory, and appear consistently in all city and telephone directories through 1976. They were previously listed on a farm in Marion Township in the 1940 census.


