Narrative Description

This is a one-story frame ranch house on the north side of W. Jefferson Street. The house sits on a poured concrete foundation, and it is clad with wide wood siding. The hip roof is covered with asphalt shingles. The windows are wood with aluminum storm / screens. There is a one car attached garage at the east end of the house, and a wood deck is tucked in the southeast corner.

The façade, the south elevation, is divided into two sections. On the right/east, the attached one-car garage and front entry are recessed several feet from the remainder of the façade. A square wood column supports the roof at the southeast corner of the roof. The entry, to the left/west of the garage door, is reached by a set of concrete steps leading up to a concrete stoop. There is a decorative window in the upper half of the vinyl door, and an aluminum storm / screen door. The second/west/left section of the façade has an oriel window with angled sides. There is a casement window in each of the angled sides, with a larger fixed window at the center. To the far left, there is a pair of one-over-one-light double-hung windows at the west corner of the house.

The west elevation has three one-over-one-light double-hung windows. One is located at the far right/south side of the elevation, at the southwest corner of the house. The second window is at the middle of the elevation, and the third window is at the far left/north, at the rear corner of the house.

The east elevation, the garage, has a one-over-one-light double-hung window.

The rear of the house, the north elevation, has a wood deck in the corner formed by the east / west wing of the house and the north wing. There is a vinyl patio door located at the approximate center of the first/east/left section, the recessed portion of this elevation. To the right of the patio door, there is a set of three-light wood casement windows. Just beyond the casement windows, the north protruding wing extends away from the house. The east side of this wing has an entry with a wood screen door. At the north corner of this section, there is a hexagonal window placed high on the wall. The north side of this wing has two wood rectangular single-light awning windows evenly distributed across the wall.

Narrative Statement of Significance

The Lafe and Ruth Stout House appears to appears to contribute historically and architecturally to the potential "west side" residential historic district in Washington. The ranch house was built during the period of development of the neighborhood in the 1950s and 1960s with construction of additional houses on previously undeveloped lots and portions of larger parcels, and it is significant within this period of later development of the neighborhood. The period of significance for the historic district is anticipated to extend through 1969, so it would fall within this period.

This house does not appear eligible for individual listing on the National Register of Historic Places under Criteria A, B, or C. The house does not appear to have particular historic or architectural significance individually.

History / research summary of property

Lot 7 was owned with Lot 3 to the north by the Bratten/Murdock family who lived at 523 W. Washington on Lot 3 through the first half of the 20th century. Sanborn maps show their house to the north on Lot 3 and show Lot 7 as a vacant lot through 1943. The south 122 feet of Out Lot 7 was first sold as a separate parcel on June 23, 1949 when Elsie S. Murdock and husband sold it to local contractor Donald Foss. Foss returned the north 16 ½ feet of the parcel to Murdock on May 12, 1952, and two weeks later, on May 27, 1952, he sold this property to Lafe Stout. The assessor lists a construction date of 1951 for this house, which appears to be accurate. The 1952 telephone directory lists Lyle Stout living at 516 W. Jefferson Street, which is corrected to Lafe Stout by 1954. He appears in subsequent telephone directories through 1962. On June 15, 1959, the property transferred from Lafe Stout and wife to Ruth S. Stout. The 1964 city directory lists Mrs. Ruth Stout, widow of Lafe, living here. She is listed again in the 1967, 1969, and 1972 city directories.

Ruth S. Stout sold the property to Minnie G. Witthoft on April 1, 1974, and Mrs. John Witthoft is listed as the occupant at 516 W. Jefferson Street in the 1976 city directory. Her estate later sold the property in 1979 to Richard Humston, who owned it until 1997.


