Narrative Description

This is a one-story frame ranch house on the south side of W. Jefferson Street. It sits on a concrete block foundation, and it is clad with wide wood siding. The side gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles. The windows are two-over-two-light double-hung wood windows, with horizontal muntins, a typical style for the 1950s. The windows have aluminum storm / screens and shutters. There is an attached one-car garage at the east end of the house.

The façade, the north elevation, has two sections. On the left/east, the northeast corner is inset, with the attached garage and two entries doors. A square wood column supports the northeast corner of the roof. The garage door is wood and includes a row of fixed windows. To the right/east of the garage door, there is an entry into the garage. Immediately to its right/west, there is a the main entry, which has a concrete stoop with metal railings. This door is wood with three horizontal fixed windows in the upper half of the door. The remainder of the facade is then the typical depth. Roughly centered overall, there is a picture window flanked by narrow horizontal two-over-two-light double-hung windows. To the right/west, there is a two-over-two-light double-hung window.

The west elevation has two evenly spaced hortizontal two-over-two-light double-hung windows.

The east elevation, the wall of the garage, has no fenestration.

The rear of the house, the south elevation, has a two-over-two-light double-hung window at the far left/west end of the wall. To the right, there is a smaller two-over-two-light double-hung window with a sill slightly higher than typical for this house. At the approximate center of this elevation, there is a nother smaller two-over-two-light double-hung window. Roughly centered on the east half, there is a ground level entry with a aluminum storm / screen entry door. There are three basement windows on this side of the house.

Narrative Statement of Significance

The Henry and Freida Witthoft House appears to contribute historically and architecturally to the potential "west side" residential historic district in Washington. The ranch house was built during the period of development of the neighborhood in the 1950s and 1960s with construction of additional houses on previously undeveloped lots and portions of larger parcels, and it is significant within this period of later development of the neighborhood. The period of significance for the historic district is anticipated to extend through 1969, so it would fall within this period.

This house does not appear eligible for individual listing on the National Register of Historic Places under Criteria A, B, or C. The house does not appear to have particular historic or architectural significance individually.

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History / research summary of property

Lot 4 is depicted as a vacant lot on the 1894 atlas and Sanborn maps from 1909, 1917, 1931, and 1943. The property (lot 4 and west 3' of lot 3) was purchased through a referee deed by Donald S. Foss, a local housing contractor, on June 26, 1957. The assessor lists a construction date of 1958, which appears to be accurate. He sold it to Henry and Frieda Witthoft on December 31, 1958. The 1960 telephone directory lists Henry Witthoft at 525 W. Jefferson. The property transferred from Freida Witthoft to her husband Henry on October 14, 1960. Henry Witthoft is listed at 525 W. Jefferson Street in every telephone and city directory through 1976. The 1964 city directory notes that he is retired. His daughter, Mrs. Frances Miller, is also listed in the 1962 telephone directory, though not in other directories. Henry Witthoft died on June 24, 1977.

The heirs of Henry Witthoft sold the property to son Arthur J. and Martha E. Witthoft on March 20, 1978. Arthur died on February 11, 2013, and Martha continues to own the house.




